On behalf of Greater Clark County School Nutrition Services, I would like to welcome our students to the 2022-2023 school year. We hope you enjoyed your summer and are excited to be returning to school.

To help prepare for the upcoming school year we want to make sure that you are aware that the federal waiver issued during the COVID-19 pandemic by the USDA providing free meals to all students has expired.

Ensuring that students are well fed throughout the school day is our top priority. Out of the 30 million lunches that were administered through the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) prior to the waiver, almost three-quarters of those were provided to students at no charge or at a reduced price. We want to remind and inform families to take advantage of these meal benefits. Income eligibility guidelines are available through the Food & Nutrition Service of the USDA. All families should apply for these benefits at www.nlappscloud.com or by filling out a paper application which will be available at your child's school in the office. If approved, students can eat at a free or reduced price in our cafes for both breakfast and lunch.
