Who Qualifies?

Children and youth who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence, including those who are:

- Living in shelters
- Staying in motels or hotels
- Sharing housing due to loss of housing or economic hardship
- Living in vehicles, campgrounds, or other temporary situations
